- Mahogany sideboard, workstand, 1 dozen silver desert spoons
- My Negro boy named Richard

Item: If either daughter dies without issue, her share belongs to the other and her heirs. If son dies without any lawful issue, lands and real estate belongs to daughters and heirs.
