To all whom it may concern, be it known, that St. Elizabeth H. Godwin of Queen Anne's County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me therein moving as also in full consideration of one dollar current money to me in hand, have released from Slavery and manumitted, and by their presents do release from Slavery and manumit my following named Negroes, in (name in number) at the several periods of time, hereinafter mentioned to wit: 1. Rebecca Jane Brown now about 40 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and fifty four, 2. Fanny the African about 38 years old on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and fifty four, 3. James Griffin, about about 18 years old on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and sixty one, 4. Elizabeth H. Godwin about 18 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and sixty one, 5. James, Brown about 12 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and seventy two, 6. Nathan Brown about 9 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and seventy three, 7. Eliza Ann Brown about 4 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and seventy four, 8. Ellen Brown about about 4 years old, on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and seventy five, 9. William Henry about 3 months old on the 1st day of January Eighteen hundred and eighty one. all my said Negroes, I do declare to be free manumitted and discharged in manner aforesaid, from all servitude to me my heirs executors and administrators, from and after the the execution of the Terms respectively herein used to them hereon: In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty seventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one.
