Now that the Bomburger execution is over, and the murderer has received the punishment to which he was sentenced, the people of Cando especially and of North Dakota in general will experience a feeling of relief. It is a matter over which North Dakota can congratulate itself, that Bomburger did not meet with mob violence, when captured after the murder. The end which was desired—the death of the murderer, has been brought about legally. The execution, too, was a perfect success. Sheriff McCune, who had the matter in hand, deserves credit for the coolness which has characterized him in the rather try-ordeals through which he has passed in connection with the whole affair. The ends of law and justice have been satisfied and the state at large, as well as the officers who were immediately concerned, are to be congratulated on the way the affair has at last been ended.
