

# HE WAS LYNCHED.

## A THOUSAND MEN THIRSTING FOR THE BLOOD OF BAUMBERGER.

The Murderer of the Kreiders in Charge of a Sheriff and on the Way From Manitoba to Cando, S. D.

WINNIPEG, Man., July 10. — Sheriff McCune, of Devil's Lake, left Deloraine yesterday having in custody Baumberger, the murderer of the six Kreiders at Cando. Soon after his departure 30 men arrived at Deloraine from Cando, having hurried through with the determination to lynch the murderer, but the sheriff eluded them and is now on his way to Cando. The Candoites say he will certainly be lynched, as 1,000 men are ready to take him from the sheriff.

### BAUMBERGER LYNCHED.

CANDO, N. D., July 10.—Baumberger, the murderer of the Krieder family, was lynched to-day.

### BAUMBERGER CAPTURED.

The Slayer of the Kreider Family Caught in Manitoba.

A dispatch was received in Lebanon on Sunday night which says that Albert Baumberger, the brutal murderer of six members of the Kreider family at Cando, N. D., has been captured at Beloraine, Manitoba, which is 60 miles from the spot where the butchery was committed. Baumberger's parents live at Annville, Lebanon county, and Daniel S. Kreider and his family moved West from Lebanon 15 years ago. Kreider's brothers all live in Lebanon county. Baumberger is a nephew of the dead man.

The bodies of Kreider, his wife and four children, three of whom were girls, were shipped on Sunday from Cando for Lebanon. The four survivors of the family and K. Brightbill accompany the dead.

Cando business men offered a reward of \$500 for Baumberger's capture.

The mother of Albert Baumberger, the young murderer, went to Harisburg to attend market on Saturday. She lives near Annville. When there she learned for the first time of her son's awful crime, and the poor woman broke down and wept. She was then taken home. Albert ran away from home when 14 years old, and his parents have never seen him since.

### TO BE BURIED IN THIS COUNTY.

Daniel Kreider, who with his family was murdered, went from Annville Lebanon county, fifteen years ago and afterwards moved to North Dakota. His wife was a daughter of John H. Rissler a well known citizen of Mt. Joy township, who lives about three miles east of Elizabethtown. The bodies of the six members of the family who were murdered are on the way to Pennsylvania now. They are expected to arrive at Elizabethtown by Wednesday or Thursday. The funeral will take place from the home of the father of Mrs. Kreider, and the interment will be made at Rissler's meeting house.
