

# THE KREIDER FAMILY.

EACH MEMBER OF IT VERY ROBUST AND COMELY IN APPEARANCE.

A Cut From a Recent Photograph—The Survivors of the Tragedy at their Grandparents' Country Home.

The cut herewith given is from a photograph of the Kreider family of ten, six of whom were murdered. The particulars of the tragedy, which occurred at Cando, N. D., on July 7, have been fully given in the INTELLIGENCER. The first information of the butchery was given by the INTELLIGENCER, which printed, exclusively, a double-leaded dispatch from Cando on the day of its occurrence.

Albert F. Baumbergerer, the murderer, is in prison, and it is expected there will be a special session of court, so that he may be given the speedy trial the people of Towner county demand.

In an interview with a reporter Baumberger said he committed the crimes because of a threat made by Annie, the oldest daughter. He was in love with her and she repulsed his advances. On the night before the murder he entered her room and made improper proposals. She told him she would tell her father of his conduct. Fearing she would do so he concluded to kill the family.

The four that he did not kill are living with their grandfather, John H. Risser, near Elizabethtown.

Aaron S. Kreider, of Palmyra, brother of the murdered man, has gone to Cando to take charge of the estate, which consists of a farm of 900 acres, well stocked.
