

TAKEN TO CANDO.

Bomberger Is There Imprisoned
Awaiting His Doom—The Gallows
Within Sight of His Crime.

A dispatch from Cando, N. D., dated January 16, says: Sheriff McCune arrived here at 2 o'clock to-day, with Bomberger. He was taken to the court house, where he will remain till Friday. The county jail is a condemned prison, and hence his confinement in the court house. No one is allowed to see him.

While en route he was smiling and cheerful, and seemed to have no fear of the end. He said to your reporter: "If people think I am going to weaken and break down at the gallows, they will get fooled." He has not heard from his folks, and thinks they have given him up.

The hanging will take place at 1 o'clock on Friday. The gallows is 24 feet high, surrounded by an enclosure 6 feet high, in a hollow, one mile from town. Ten thousand people could see the execution from the high banks and surrounding hill. The condemned man will face the south, and if the day is bright he can readily see the house where he committed the deed. A special train will be run for 50 miles down the line on Friday.
